

WHITE CHRISTMAS' is arguably the most famous song of all time; certainly it's the biggest seller, and it's probably also the most-recorded. The original recording was, of course by Bing Crosby, whose version has sold in its countless millions over the ensuing seventy-nine years. Its writer, IRVING BERLIN, was famously the only Oscar presenter ever to open the envelope to read out his own name as the winner, when it won the Academy Award for 'Best Original Song' in the 1942 movie Holiday Inn. It was soon established as a 'Standard' and was regularly revived throughout the 50s, by artists as diverse as Elvis Presley, Frank Sinatra, The Ravens, Ella Fitzgerald, Mantovani, Emile Ford, Peggy Lee, Walter Brennan, Chet Atkins, Les Paul & Mary Ford, Mahalia Jackson, The Drifters, Big Maybelle, Bobby Vee, Sister Rosetta Tharpe, and many more. This inspired compilation presents twenty-eight memorable versions; nine male vocalists, seven female vocalists, seven vocal groups/duos, five instrumentals.







Frankie Howerd turned bluster, innuendo and mock outrage into an art form. After faltering post-war radio performances, he used his shyness to his advantage. With stuttering, embarrassment and over-the-top outrage, he created a unique character. His catchphrases include "Ooh Missus!", "Titter ye not", and "Control Yourselves" - which he used to magnificent effect in comedy series, sketches and interviews. His most famous role was Lurcio, the bone-idle slave involved in the shenanigans and intrigue of his master's Roman Empire household in Up Pompeii. From the rambling prologue to the over-acting cast, Howerd was in his element, dishing out puns, double-entrendres and innuendo; feigning shock at the bawdy exploits of characters such as Ludicrus Sextus, Nausius, Erotica, Stovus Primus and James Bondus. Vestal virgins, soothsayers, poisonous asps, loose togas, love potions and revolting slaves form the basis for these titillating and hilarious episodes. As Lurcio said: "You wont' get anything like this in vour Harold Pinter!"

In Churchill Said to Me, Frankie Howerd's stuttering Private Potts has just two aims in life: to do as little work as possible and to avoid physical injury. His uncanny resemblance to Fearless Freddy Hollocks. a respected general with a will of iron, might help him to survive, but the demanding Colonel Witherton and the screeching Sergeant Major Ruckus put a swift end to Potts' hope of a quiet war.


Frankie Howerd broke the mould of the comedy performer, bringing the audience into his realm and making them a part of the show. He pioneered the art of breaking the fourth wall, with a very British sense of humour, understated, intimate and down to earth. He is a founding father of modern comedy.







ROSEMARY SQUIRES (BE 1928-2023

Known as the "British Doris Day", Rosemary Squires was an English jazz, big band, cabaret and concert singer and recording artist. Her career began aged 12 in 1940, with an appearance on the BBC Home Service's *Children's Hour*.

Daughter of a civil servant, Rosemary was born in Bristol, where she took singing, guitar and piano lessons while at school. During the war she entertained the troops by singing on UK and US army bases around Salisbury. She moved from Salisbury to London in 1948 at 20 years of age and became a professional singer, performing with big bands such as Ted Heath, Geraldo and Cyril Stapleton. She worked



alongside Morecambe & Wise, Ken Dodd, Alma Cogan, Frankie Vaughan and Vince Hill in summer seasons at leading theatre venues and also appeared in the BBC Festival of Jazz at the Royal Albert Hall. In the 1950s and 1960s, she was a regular on the BBC Light Programme, performing on *Melody Time* and *Workers' Playtime*. Her television appearances include comedy series *Let's Stay Home*, (1956); comedy series *After Hours*, (1958–59); *Musical Playhouse* (1959); the *Arthur Haynes Show* (1964); *Hooray for Laughter*, (1967) with Ted Ray, John Junkin and Reg Varney and *The Good Old Days* (1976), among many others. She also made TV appearances on *Six-Five Special*, and *Juke Box Jury*.

She also worked in the United States with Danny Kaye and Sammy Davis Jr., and appeared on the *Johnny Carson Show*. In 1994, Squires took part in the entertainment for Prince Edward's 30th birthday celebrations. Encouraged and aided by her friend, saxophonist Vic Ash, she created a Doris Day tribute show. Opening in October 1996, the show ran continuously for seven years. She also undertook two countrywide tours to celebrate her own diamond jubilee in show business, with two appearances at the Royal Festival Hall during the 2012 Royal Diamond Jubilee year. Squires recorded the *"Now hands that do dishes…"* jingle as part of the Fairy Liquid detergent advertisement, which remained in use until 2000. Her singles include: *Band of Gold* (1956); *You Can't Run Away With It* (1956); *There Goes My Lover* (1958); *You Got* (1962) and *Once There Was You* (1967). Squires returned to live in Salisbury in 1983, continuing to perform at local charity events. In 1991, she married retired Police Divisional Commander



Frank Lockyer. She became the president of the Studio Theatre in Salisbury and in 1984, she was awarded the Gold Badge of Merit by the British Academy of Songwriters, Composers and Authors. She was made a Member of the Order of the British Empire in 2004 for her services to music and charity, and in 2012, she was awarded the British Music Hall Society's Lifetime Achievement Award.

Rosemary Squires died on 8th August 2023, aged 94. Her death was not announced until 18th September, in the *Salisbury Journal*. Her funeral took place on 25th September.

HAROLD BAIM & "THE QUOTA QUICKIES" Richard Jeffs has written about the short documentaries

originally made for UK Cinema release by Harold Baim.

When we went to "the pictures" in the early '80s we went to see the main feature film; but we got more. We watched a commercial for the "Indian Restaurant, just 200 yards from this cinema"; we saw adverts for "Kia-Ora" and "Butterkist Popcorn". We also got a short film, usually a travelogue, running between 15 and 30 minutes. As an

audience most of us didn't realise that these films had to be shown – by law. The projectionist probably called the short feature a "Quota Quickie".

From 1927, when the ratio of American import to British film had dropped to sixteen to one, the Government introduced a mandatory "quota" of British made films. The Cinematograph Films Act of 1927 forced distributors to show a healthy percentage of British made product. However, the Act overlooked any sort of "quality threshold". Alexander Korda made early films for the quota, producing dramatic offerings with performances from Merle Oberon, Laurence Olivier, Jessie Matthews, Vivien Leigh, Rex Harrison, and others. Dramatic features, or 'B-movies' proved financially too high a risk for most producers and by the 50s and 60s, the quota was filled by short documentary features.

The short films could be cheap and sometimes very poor. Some producers tried scripted dramas: the "B" picture. Others made documentaries. Lack of investment in films had the undesired effect of giving the British film industry a bad name. On the Rank circuit, *Look at Life* received a block booking in every cinema. At A.B.C. it was Pathé News or Pathé Pictorial.

American distributor United Artists distributed some of the greatest cinema hits of the 60s and insisted that they were accompanied by one of their own shorts, produced by British film producer, director and writer Harold Baim. Baim made nearly all his films in colour and only filmed on sunny days, aware that his short features would be seen by audiences next to major features filmed in California or the Mediterranean. A story about the film *Telly Savalas Looks at Birmingham* relates that when he awoke in his Birmingham hotel and saw the overcast sky, it is alleged he phoned the Met. Office and asked when the sun would come out, only to be told "Not today in Brum. To get any sun you will have to travel south". This may explain the sudden appearance of the Cotswolds and Bibury Fish Farm in the middle of the film on Birmingham. Images of the rich golden Cotswold stone of the village of Broadway inspired his line "You can give my regards to this Broadway anytime".

To guarantee that "quota" films could be made there was a tax on cinema seats. The more "bums on seats" the more money the producer received. A 15 minute film received more

money than a 30 minute "Quota-Quickie". The film accompanying the Beatles *A Hard Days Night* was a real money-spinner. This film, called *Jugglers and Acrobats*, was stored away by Harold Baim together with about 150 other film titles. It was a unique record of the last "Variety Acts;" Winston Foxwell, Vic Templar and Della Sweetman, Bobby Daniels, Verinoca Martell, Peggy Bourne and others perform amazing juggling and acrobatic acts for the camera.

Well known voices from BBC Radio & Television read Baim's often pun-filled scripts; Terry Wogan, Nicholas Parsons, Pete Murray & more. Most of the music came from the De Wolfe Music library. Harold Baim died in 1996 in his 80s. The Baim Collection is one of the largest collections of its kind in private ownership.



The series was set ten years later than the book, so Blott would have been too young to have served in World War II. Through flashbacks it is revealed that he was an Eastern European soldier who accidentally found himself stuck on a bridge between the eastern and western sides of the Iron Curtain. Refused re-entry to the East, he was brought to England to be employed by Lady Maud's father. In a plot which remains relevant today, the series follows the comedic efforts of a member of the landed gentry, Sir Giles Lynchwood, to build a motorway through the grounds of the country pile he acquired when he married Lady Maud. Lady Maud, frustrated by a marriage rarely consummated, employs the military skills of gardener Blott in a campaign to prevent her husband's cash-grabbing plans. She is unaware that Sir Giles is involved in a fetishist affair with a local lady, useful information in a divorce case, as he would not receive the house and lands were this discovered. Can Blott aid Lady Maud with his army training and a secret cache of war equipment discovered on the estate? Will the new motorway be prevented or will the idyllic rural area and local villages indeed be ruined by a blot on the landscape?

These compilations, inspired by a suggestion from DJ Bernie 'Rock'n'Roll Heaven' Keith, feature three-and-a-half dozen 'Sub-Two Minute Wonders' – forty-two killer tracks which get the business done in two minutes or less. There's a bit of everything here; hits, misses and some that got away. The tracks include artists such as Elvis, Eddie Cochran, Buddy Holly, Johnny Cash, Jerry Lee Lewis, Ray Charles, Del Shannon, Fats Domino, Ray Charles, the Everlys, Bobby Darin, Duane Eddy, Ricky Nelson, The Coasters, Jack Scott and many more.
