



In 1964 I entered a competition to meet The Searchers by listing a set of their songs in order for an LP. The prize was to see them in a concert and meet them backstage afterwards. We travelled to a relative in Croydon where the concert took place and went to the Odeon. Afterwards we approached the manager, who knew nothing about it but took us along to the boys' dressing room. They knew nothing about it either but were fantastic and we had a lovely time. They gave me a copy of their new single, "What have they done to the Rain?" I still have it. My Mum wrote to the organisers and said it was shocking that neither that Manager nor The Searchers knew anything about the competition. Myself and another girl, (who presumably won too), were then treated to an overnight stay in the Cumberland Hotel, London, a tour of the Christmas lights and – dinner with The Searchers! Again, they were fabulous and we had a wonderful time. I was only 13 at the time and attach a photo of the first meeting (thank goodness the label was no lower) and my signed LP. I'm indebted to my brother for introducing me to your TV station and programme which I record every week. Long may it continue. Kind regards, Joy

As a nine year old ABC minor in 1954 I was at the Royalty Cinema off Ladbroke Grove in London, on a Saturday morning paying the manager announced we had a special visitor from Mars! I thought we were getting free choccies but the actual Devil Woman from Mars was making a personal appearance in full costume pointing her ray gun at all and sundry! I didn't know it at the time but it was the fabulous actress Patricia Laffan doing a personal appearance. I've read years later that she did four cinemas that morning in full costume so well done to her for the promotion. I've watched the film many times since and all the cast give it their all and I love it. Keep the programmes coming, best wishes. David Williams

Mum played 'Miss Braishfield' and wore an upside-down basket on her head! Una, AKA Aunt Sally, got on famously well with my mum - she used to put her bag on the seat next to her on the coach and when my mum got on, she would remove her bag and tap the seat so my mum could sit next to her! Bill Maynard AKA Captain Beetroot, would turn up on the set with a 'put you up bed' in his red thermals and have a kip between takes. The late Geoffrey Bayldon was great and bought the cast ice creams and ice lollies! Lots of photos, stories and memories. Mum was 39 at the time, now 81. Thank you TPTV. P.S. 

A recent wonderful edition of The Footage Detectives featured a short item showing some 1960s Police cars. Two cars shown were Farina-designed saloons, referred to on the programme as looking "a bit like an Austin". Both the cars shown were in fact Wolseley 15/60s. All the 1960s Farina saloons, (Austin, Morris, MG, Wolseley and Riley) looked similar in profile, but their

bonnets and radiator grilles differed.



All Wolseley cars were distinguishable by an illuminated "Wolseley" badge in the middle of the main grille, near the top – clearly seen on the two film clips.

The studio talk of **Dixon of Dock Green** brought back memories. I used to watch the early black and white editions on Saturday nights, seated on my Dad's knees. For years afterwards, we would always greet each other with: "Evenin' all" and, when I was sent to bed, it would be to the words: "Mind 'ow you go!".

In the film *The Blue Lamp*, in which Constable Dixon was shot dead by a shop thief, the Police pursue the killer. There is a sequence where a very old 1930s Wolseley 14/60 Police car is used in a car chase, lurching around a sharp righthand corner, bell ringing and tyres howling in protest. The driver was my late uncle, Sergeant Des Woodjetts, traffic officer in the Brighton police traffic division. Apparently, the film company contacted Brighton police to ask if one of their drivers would be interested in taking on the job and his superior officer



recommended Uncle Des. I have watched the film frame by frame, to see if I could identify him, but sadly, reflections of the street and film lights on the windscreen made this impossible. I enclose a photograph of him, taken in the 1950s, standing next to a 1953 Morris Oxford in the back lanes of Brighton.


I always enjoy your brilliant show and previous editions on catch-up, from the time before I was told about the series. I am determined not to have missed ANY of them!

This explanation is woven into the drama. Filming took place at Sandringham and Holkham Hall, in Norfolk, with Andalucia in Spain serving as Gallipoli.





Despite an eight month campaign, the will of the British could not be broken and the Blitz went down in history as a failure. This incredible box set features three documentary films with interviews from those who were there.

Between 7th September 1940 and 11th May 1941 over 40,000 civilians were killed and more than a million houses destroyed in London alone, plus destruction in many other cities including Hull, Liverpool and the ports.

Despite the 8-month campaign, the will of the British could not be broken. Bruce Vigar's films portray the main events and aftermath of the German bombings of Britain with interviews and footage giving insight into the atmosphere felt throughout the country; and the attitude that came to be known as the 'Blitz Spirit'.

# **EKRAYS** MAD AXEMAN

This film is based on the true story of Frank Mitchell, whose escape from Dartmoor Prison was masterminded by the notorious Kray Twins, 10 days before Christmas, 1966, Considered Britain's most dangerous convict, a nationwide manhunt was triggered by this audacious breakout. Frank is secretly held in East London, with a Minder and a Mistress for company, as events begin to spiral out of control. Frank is menacing, physically powerful and short-tempered. Unable to leave due to the ongoing manhunt, he grows increasingly frustrated and John struggles to control him. **Elstree Studios Tony Murphy** reminisces about life in Borehamwood in the 50s & 60s.

A recent edition of The Footage Detectives featured views of Watford and a mention of Borehamwood, Elstree and the film studios, which really got my memory going. I moved to

Borehamwood in 1955 with my parents and lived there until my early twenties.



I vividly remember going shopping with my mother to Watford on the Greenline bus and getting off at the first stop in the high street which was always teeming with shoppers. As we got off the bus we were mesmerised by the wonderful aroma of freshly roasting coffee beans coming from "Importers," where my mother purchased our monthly luxury of Blue Mountain Beans. The shop

was run by two men in white coats and the coffee beans were sold from coal scuttle shaped bright red bins. This, I am sure is the reason for my lifelong obsession with good coffee. I would then try and drag my mother to the top of the high street to the pond, to stare at the goldfish. I remember the Grosvener restaurant in Borehamwood which, if memory serves, was at the end of the parade of shops right next door to the A.B.P.C. studios, where Richard Burton and Elizabeth Taylor dined when filming in Borehamwood. I saw them in the back of a white Rolls Royce in a traffic jam. I was on my Lambretta so it must have been either 1966 or 67. I regularly saw Roger Moore on my way to work, in the White Volvo 1800e which had an 'E' suffix reg. plate so was a 1967 registered car. You have mentioned all the iconic studios that have come and gone in Borehamwood but what about MGM? The last film to be made there was *The Dirty Dozen* with Lee Marvin – a legendary drinker, apparently - according to my schoolmate's mother who worked there. When filming ended, the local residents were much relieved, as it was mainly shot at night and gunfire and explosions went on for weeks. Finally, a mate of mine, Ronnie, worked behind the bar at the "Gate" pub in Arkley, just the other side of the A1 from Borehamwood.



The pub was down a quiet dead end country lane and Trevor Howard lived a very short walk away so was a regular. On many occasions the phone would ring after stop tap and an extremely upper class lady would enquire "has Trevor left yet"? "Yes Mrs Howard, about 30 mins. ago." "Oh do be a dear and go and look for him would you?!" Ronnie would go down the lane and find Trevor face down on the grass verge, pick him up and carry him home.
